Personal independence payment (PIP) is a new benefit for people who need help taking part in everyday life or who find it difficult to get around It replaces disability living allowance for people between the ages of 16 and 64 inclusive The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) are responsible for PIP

Personal Independence Payment If you have Multiple System Atrophy (MSA) and are under state pension age you may be entitled to Personal Independence Payment (PIP) This is because you are likely to require support or supervision to meet your personal care needs and/or may have difficulties with walking or mobility

**Disability benefits: Personal Independence Payment and ...**

To qualify for Personal Independence Payment (PIP), you must: be under State Pension age (or have been invited to claim if under 65 on 8 April 2013) have had difficulties with daily living or getting around (see list of activities below) for three months before claiming, and

**Personal Independence Payment letter (notification): PIP 7011**

Although you're not getting Personal Independence Payment you may be able to get other benefits and services, including Housing Benefit and Council Tax Reduction scheme If you're in a paid job or unemployed and about to start work, Access to Work may pay

**Personal Independence Payment - Parkinson's UK**

you may be able to claim Personal Independence Payment (PIP) If you're making a new claim for PIP, you must start it before you reach State Pension age (see section on age rules, below, for more details) PIP is for you, not for a carer (if you have one), and you don't need to have someone supporting or caring for you to qualify
